<u>I. We Must Humble Ourselves</u> Philippians 2:3-4 NIV

3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, 4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.





<u>I. We Must Humble Ourselves</u> John 15:5 NIV

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.

II. We Must Pray Matthew 6:8b NIV

...for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

II. We Must Pray 2 Corinthians 10:3-5 NIV

3 For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. 4 The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. 5 We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.





II. We Must Pray Psalm 51:1-2 NIV

1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. 2 Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

"So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

III. We Must Seek His Face Deuteronomy 4:29-30 NIV

29 But if from there you seek the LORD your God, you will find him if you seek him with all your heart and with all your soul. 30 When you are in distress and all these things have happened to you, then in later days you will return to the LORD your God and obey him.

7 Hear my voice when I call, LORD; be merciful to me and answer me.

III. We Must Seek His Face Psalm 27:7-12 NIV

10 Though my father and mother forsake me, the LORD will receive me.
11 Teach me your way, LORD; lead me in a straight path because of my oppressors.
12 Do not turn me over to the desire of my foes,

for false witnesses rise up against me, spouting malicious accusations.

IV. We Must Turn From Our Wicked Ways 1 Corinthians 10:13 NIV

No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it.





IV. We Must Turn From Our Wicked Ways James 4:7 NIV

Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

Previous Scripture: 1 Corinthians 10:13; Psalm 27:7-12; Deuteronomy 4:29-30





IV. We Must Turn From Our Wicked Ways James 5:16 NIV

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

IV. We Must Turn From Our Wicked Ways 1 John 5:14-15 NIV

14 This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. 15 And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him.
