1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. 2 Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. 3 And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." 4 At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. 5 "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." 6 Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. 7 With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for." 8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? All of us have become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags; we all shrivel up like a leaf, and like the wind our sins sweep us away.








Isaiah said this because he saw Jesus' glory and spoke about him.

# II. God Deals With Our Hearts Matthew 12:34-35 NIV



34 You brood of vipers, how can you who are evil say anything good? For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of. 35 A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in him.



### II. God Deals With Our Hearts Psalm 51:10 NIV



Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.



### II. God Deals With Our Hearts Romans 3:10-12 NIV



#### 10 As it is written:

"There is no one righteous, not even one;

- there is no one who understands; there is no one who seeks God.
- 12 All have turned away,
  they have together become worthless;
  there is no one who does good,
  not even one."



# III. God Elicits Our Response Isaiah 6:8 NIV

# III. God Elicits Our Response Genesis 12:4 NIV



So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran.



# III. God Elicits Our Response Hebrews 11:8 NIV



By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going.



# III. God Elicits Our Response Exodus 3:10-11 NIV



10 So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."

11 But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?"



### III. God Elicits Our Response Joshua 24:15b NIV



But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD.



### III. God Elicits Our Response Jonah 1:2-3 NIV



- 2 "Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it, because its wickedness has come up before me."
- 3 But Jonah ran away from the LORD and headed for Tarshish. He went down to Joppa, where he found a ship bound for that port. After paying the fare, he went aboard and sailed for Tarshish to flee from the LORD.



# III. God Elicits Our Response Jeremiah 1:5-6 NIV



5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."

6 "Alas, Sovereign LORD," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am too young."
