John 4:19-24 NIV

19 "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. 20 Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."

21 "Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. 22 You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. 23 Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks.

I. How Should We Worship? Psalm 33:1-3 NIV



1 Sing joyfully to the LORD, you righteous; it is fitting for the upright to praise him. 2 Praise the LORD with the harp; make music to him on the ten-stringed lyre. 3 Sing to him a new song; play skillfully, and shout for joy.

I. How Should We Worship? Psalm 47:6-7 NIV



6 Sing praises to God, sing praises; sing praises to our King, sing praises. 7 For God is the King of all the earth; sing to him a psalm of praise.

I. How Should We Worship? Psalm 98:4-6 NIV



4 Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth, burst into jubilant song with music; 5 make music to the LORD with the harp, with the harp and the sound of singing, 6 with trumpets and the blast of the ram's horn shout for joy before the LORD, the King.

I. How Should We Worship? Psalm 34:1-3 NIV



1 I will extol the LORD at all times; his praise will always be on my lips. 2 I will glory in the LORD; let the afflicted hear and rejoice. 3 Glorify the LORD with me; let us exalt his name together.

II. Why Should We Worship? Psalm 93:4 NIV



Mightier than the thunder of the great waters, mightier than the breakers of the sea— the LORD on high is mighty.

II. Why Should We Worship? Ephesians 1:19-23 NIV



19 and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength 20 he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, 21 far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. 22 And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, 23 which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

II. Why Should We Worship? Psalm 96:4 NIV



For great is the LORD and most worthy of praise; he is to be feared above all gods.

"As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.

III. Who Should Worship? John 10:27-30 NIV
