



Luke 10:25-29 NIV

25 On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. “Teacher,” he asked, “what must I do to inherit eternal life?”

26 “What is written in the Law?” he replied. “How do you read it?”

27 He answered, “ ‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind’; and, ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ ”

28 “You have answered correctly,” Jesus replied. “Do this and you will live.”

29 But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”



Luke 10:30-35 NIV

30 In reply Jesus said: “A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. 31 A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. 32 So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. 33 But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. 34 He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. 35 The next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. ‘Look after him,’ he said, ‘and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.’



Luke 10:36-37 NIV

36 “Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?”

37 The expert in the law replied, “The one who had mercy on him.”

Jesus told him, “Go and do likewise.”

Psalm 10:4 NIV

Leviticus 19:18 NIV

“ ‘Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone **among your people**, but **love your neighbor as yourself**. I am the LORD.



Luke 10:28 AT

Then He said to him, "You have answered correctly. Do this and you will live."



Deuteronomy 30:16-18 NIV

16 For I command you today to **love** the LORD [YHWH] your God, to **walk in obedience** to him, and to **keep his commands**, decrees and laws; **then you will live and increase**, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land you are entering to possess.

17 But **if your heart turns away** and **you are not obedient**, and if you are drawn away to bow down to other gods and worship them, 18 I declare to you this day that **you will certainly be destroyed**. You will **not live long in the land** you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess.



Deuteronomy 30:19-20 NIV

19 This day I call the heavens and the earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you **life and death, blessings and curses**. Now **choose life**, so that **you and your children may live** 20 and that you may **love the LORD** your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. For the LORD is your life, and **he will give you many years in the land** he swore to give to your fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.



Luke 10:29 AT

Sirach 12:1-4 NRSV

- 1 If you do good, know to whom you do it,
and you will be thanked for your good deeds.
- 2 **Do good to the devout**, and you will be repaid—
if not by them, certainly by the Most High.
- 3 **No good comes to one who persists in evil**
or to one who does not give alms.
- 4 **Give to the devout, but do not help the sinner.**



Sirach 12:5-7 NRSV

- 5 Do good to the humble, but do not give to the ungodly; hold back their bread, and do not give it to them, for by means of it they might subdue you; then you will receive twice as much evil for all the good you have done to them.**
- 6 For the Most High also hates sinners and will inflict punishment on the ungodly.**
- 7 Give to the one who is good, but do not help the sinner.**



Luke 10:30 AT

Then, by coincidence, a priest was going down on that road. And when he saw him, he passed by on the other side.



Leviticus 21:1-4 NIV

The LORD said to Moses, “Speak to the priests, the sons of Aaron, and say to them: ‘A priest must **not make himself ceremonially unclean** for any of his people who die, ² except for a close relative, such as his mother or father, his son or daughter, his brother, ³ or an unmarried sister who is dependent on him since she has no husband—**for her he may make himself unclean.** ⁴ He must not make himself unclean for people related to him by marriage, and so **defile himself.**”



Luke 10:32 AT

Then, likewise, when a Levite also came by the place and saw him, he passed by on the other side.



Luke 10:33 AT

But a Samaritan who was traveling came by him. And when he saw him, he felt compassion.



Luke 10:34 AT

And when he came to him, he bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. Then, he put him on his own animal, led him to an inn, and took care of him.



2 Chronicles 28:14-15 NIV

14 So the soldiers gave up the prisoners and plunder in the presence of the officials and all the assembly. 15 The men designated by name took the prisoners, and from the plunder they **clothed all who were naked**. They provided them with clothes and sandals, food and drink, and **healing balm**. All those who were **weak they put on donkeys**. So they took them back to their fellow Israelites at **Jericho**, the City of Palms, and **returned to Samaria**.



Luke 10:35 AT

And on the next day, he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said, "Take care of him. And whatever more that you spend, *I* will pay back to you when I return."



Luke 10:36 AT

Which of these three do you think was a neighbor of the man who fell into [the hands of] the robbers?



Luke 10:37 AT

And the [expert in the law] said, "The one who showed mercy upon him." Then, Jesus said to him, "Go and *you* do likewise."
