



Luke 17:11-14 NIV

11 Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. 12 As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance 13 and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

14 When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.





Luke 17:15-19 NIV

15 One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. 16 He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan.

17 Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? 18 Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" 19 Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."





Luke 17:11 AT

Then, it came to pass: [Jesus] was on the way to Jerusalem and He was passing between Galilee and Samaria.





Luke 9:51 NIV

As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus **resolutely set out for Jerusalem**.





Luke 17:12 AT

Then, as He [was] going into a village, ten lepers, who stood at a distance, met Him.





Numbers 12:8-11 NIV

8 With him I speak face to face, clearly and not in riddles; he sees the form of the LORD [YHWH]. Why then were you not afraid to speak against my servant Moses?"9 The anger of the LORD [YHWH] burned against them, and he left them. 10 When the cloud lifted from above the tent, Miriam's skin was leprous—it became as white as snow. Aaron turned toward her and saw that she had a **defiling skin disease**, 11 and he said to Moses, "Please, my lord, I ask you not to hold against us the sin we have so foolishly committed.





Leviticus 13:45-46 NIV

45 "Anyone with such a defiling disease must wear torn clothes, let their hair be unkempt, cover the lower part of their face and cry out, 'Unclean! Unclean!' 46 As long as they have the disease they remain unclean. They must live alone; they must live outside the camp.





Luke 17:13 AT

And they raised their voice, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!"





Luke 22:42 NIV

"Father, **if you are willing**, take this cup from me; yet **not my will**, **but yours** be done."





Luke 17:14 AT

And, when He saw [them], He said to them, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And it came to pass: as they were going, they were cleansed.





Luke 5:14 NIV

Then Jesus ordered him, "Don't tell anyone, but go, **show yourself to the priest** and offer the sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing, as a testimony to them."





Luke 17:15 AT

Then, one of them, when he saw that he was healed, came back – glorifying God with a loud voice.





Luke 17:16 AT

And he fell facedown at the feet of Jesus, thanking Him. And he was a Samaritan.





Luke 5:12 NIV

While Jesus was in one of the towns, a man came along who was covered with leprosy.
When he saw Jesus, he fell with his face to the ground and begged him, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean."





Luke 8:41-42a NIV

41 Then a man named Jairus, a synagogue leader, came and fell at Jesus' feet,
pleading with him to come to his house 42
because his only daughter, a girl of about twelve, was dying.





Luke 17:17-18 AT

17 Then Jesus replied and said, "Were not ten cleansed? Then, *where* are the [other] nine? 18 None were found coming back to give glory to God except this foreigner?"





Luke 17:19 AT And He said to him, "Arise! Go! Your faith has saved you."





Luke 8:48 NIV

Then he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed $[\sigma\phi\zeta\omega | s\bar{o}z\bar{o}]$ you. Go in peace."





Luke 7:36-38 NIV

36 When one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, he went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. 37 A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. 38 As she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them.





Luke 7:48-50 NIV

48 Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." 49 The other guests began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?"

50 Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved [σώζω | sōzō] you; go in peace."





2 Kings 5:3 NIV

She said to her mistress, "If only my master would see the **prophet** who is in **Samaria**! He would **cure** him of his **leprosy**."





2 Kings 5:6 NIV

The letter that he took to the king of Israel read: "With this letter I am sending my servant Naaman to you so that you may **cure him of his leprosy**."





2 Kings 5:7 NIV

As soon as the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his robes and said, "Am I God? Can I kill and bring back to life? Why does this fellow send someone to me to be cured of his leprosy? See how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me!"





2 Kings 5:15 NIV

Then Naaman and all his attendants went back to the man of God. He stood before him and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the world except in Israel. So please accept a gift from your servant."





Luke 4:27 NIV

And there were **many** in **Israel with leprosy** in the time of Elisha the prophet, yet not one of them was cleansed—**only Naaman the Syrian**."





Galatians 3:7-8 NIV

7 Understand, then, that those who have faith are children of Abraham. 8 Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: "All nations will be blessed through you." [Gen 12:2-3]





Luke 13:29 NIV

People will come from **east** and **west** and **north** and **south**, and will take their places at the **feast** in the kingdom of God.
