People do not despise a thief [גַּנָּב | gannāb] if he steals | gānab] to satisfy his hunger when he is starving. (Pr 6:30, NIV)






- 7 "Two things I ask of you, LORD [YHWH]; do not refuse me before I die:
- 8 Keep falsehood and lies far from me; give me **neither poverty nor riches**, but give me **only my daily bread**.
- 9 Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, 'Who is the LORD [YHWH]?'
 Or I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of my God.

(Pr 30:7-9, NIV)















• In all cases of illegal possession of an ox, a donkey, a sheep, a garment, or any other lost property about which somebody says, 'This is mine,' both parties are to bring their cases before the judges. The one whom the judges declare guilty must pay back double to the other. (Exodus 22:9, NIV)





• 10 "If anyone gives a donkey, an ox, a sheep or any other animal to their neighbor for safekeeping and it dies or is injured or is taken away while no one is looking, 11 the issue between them will be settled by the taking of an oath before the LORD [YHWH] that the neighbor did not lay hands on the other person's property. The owner is to accept this, and **no restitution** is required. 12 But if the animal was stolen [since ganab] from the neighbor, restitution must be made to the owner. (Ex 22:10-12, NIV)






• "Whoever steals [אָנַב] *gānab*] an ox or a sheep and slaughters it or sells it must pay back five head of cattle for the ox and four sheep for the sheep. (Ex 22:1, NIV)






• 1 The LORD [YHWH] said to Moses: 2 "If anyone sins and is unfaithful to the **LORD** by **deceiving** a neighbor about something entrusted to them or left in their care or about something stolen, or if they cheat their neighbor, 3 or if they find lost property and lie about it, or if they swear falsely about any such sin that people may commit—4 when they sin in any of these ways and realize their guilt, they must return what they have stolen or taken by extortion, or what was entrusted to them, or the lost property they found, 5 or whatever it was they swore falsely about. They must make restitution in full, add a fifth of the value to it and give it all to the owner on the day they present their guilt offering. (Lev 6:1-5, NIV)















• 39 " 'If any of your fellow Israelites become poor and sell themselves to you, do not make them work as slaves. 40 They are to be treated as hired workers or temporary residents among you; they are to work for you until the Year of Jubilee. 41 Then they and their children are to be released, and they will go back to their own clans and to the property of their ancestors. 42 Because the Israelites are my servants, whom I brought out of Egypt, they must not be sold as slaves. (Lev 25:39-42, NIV)



SPECIAL CASE: THE LORD'S HOLY WAR



• 10 "When you draw near to a city to fight against it, offer terms of peace to it. 11 And if it responds to you peaceably and it opens to you, then all the people who are found in it shall do forced labor for you and shall serve you. 12 But if it makes no peace with you, but makes war against you, then you shall besiege it. 13 And when the LORD [YHWH] your God gives it into your hand, you shall put all its males to the sword, 14 but the women and the little ones, the livestock, and everything else in the city, all its spoil, you shall take as plunder for yourselves. And you shall enjoy the spoil of your enemies, which the LORD [YHWH] your God has given you. (Dt 20:10-14, ESV)





• And they burned the city with fire, and everything in it. **Only the silver and gold**, and the **vessels** of **bronze and of iron**, they put **into the treasury** of the house of the LORD. (Jos 6:24, ESV)





• But the people of Israel broke faith in regard **to the devoted things**, for **Achan** the son of Carmi, son of Zabdi, son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, **took some of the devoted things**. And the anger of the LORD [YHWH] burned against the people of Israel. (Jos 7:1, ESV)





• 11 Israel has **sinned**; they have transgressed my covenant that I commanded them; they have taken some of the devoted things; they have stolen [signab] and lied and put them among their own **belongings**. 12 Therefore the people of Israel cannot stand before their enemies. They turn their backs before their enemies, because they have become devoted for destruction. I will be with you no more, unless you destroy the devoted things from among you. (Jos 7:11-12, ESV)





• 20 And Achan answered Joshua, "Truly I have sinned against the LORD God of Israel, and this is what I did: 21 when I saw among the spoil a beautiful cloak from Shinar, and 200 shekels of silver, and a bar of gold weighing 50 shekels, then I coveted them and took them. And see, they are hidden in the earth inside my tent, with the silver underneath." (Jos 7:20-21, ESV)

• "Anyone who kidnaps [אַנַב] gānab] someone is to be put to death, whether the victim has been sold or is still in the kidnapper's possession. (Ex 21:16, NIV)





•If someone is caught kidnapping [גַּנַר] gānab] a fellow Israelite and treating or selling them as a slave, the kidnapper [[[[[gannāb] must die. You must purge the evil from among you. (Dt 24:7, NIV)





• "Whoever steals a man and sells him, and anyone found in possession of him, shall be put to death. (Ex 21:16, ESV)





• "You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's." (Ex 20:17, ESV)





•You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honor your father and mother." (Mk 10:19, NIV)





• 37 Jesus replied: " 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' [Dt 6:5] 38 This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' [Lev 19:18] 40 All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." (Mt 22:37-40, NIV; cf. Mk 12:29-31)





• 8 Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law. 9 The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not murder," "You shall not steal," "You shall not covet," and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." [Lev 19:18] 10 Love does no harm to a neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law. (Rom 13:8-10, NIV)





In fact, this is love for God: to keep his commands. And his commands are not burdensome, (1 Jn 5:3, NIV)





• 9 Or do you not know that wrongdoers will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: Neither the sexually immoral nor idolaters nor adulterers nor men who have sex with men 10 nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. 11 And that is what some of you were. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God. (1 Cor 6:9-11, NIV)





 Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with their own hands, that they may have something to share with those in need. (Eph 4:28, NIV)

CHRISTIAN CONTENTMENT



•12 I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. 13 I can do all this through him who gives me strength. (Php 4:12-13, NIV)





•15 If you suffer, it should not be as a murderer or thief or any other kind of criminal, or even as a meddler. 16 However, if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name. (1 Pet 4:15-16, NIV)





• 6 And as a penalty they must bring to the priest, that is, to the LORD [YHWH], their guilt offering, a ram from the flock, one without defect and of the proper value. 7 In this way the priest will make atonement for them before the LORD [YHWH], and they will be **forgiven** for **any of the things** they did that made them guilty." (Lev 6:6-7, NIV)
