Matthew 22:37-40 NIV

37 Jesus replied: “ ‘**Love the Lord your God** with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.’ [Dt 6:5] 38 This is the **first and greatest commandment**. 39 And the **second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’** [Lev 19:18] 40 All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.”



1 Corinthians 12:27-30 NIV

27 Now you are the **body of Christ**, and **each one of you is a part of it**. 28 And God has placed in the church first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, of guidance, and of different kinds of tongues. 29 Are all apostles? 1 Corinthians 12:31 NIV

Now eagerly desire the **greater**
gifts.

And yet I will show you the **most**
excellent way.



1 Corinthians 13:1 AT

If I speak in the tongues of humans and of angels, but do not have love, I have become a sounding brass or a clanging cymbal.



1 Corinthians 13:2 AT

And if I have the gift of prophecy and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.



1 Corinthians 13:3 AT

And if I give away all of my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I will be burned, but do not have love, I gain nothing.



1 Corinthians 13:3

If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body **to be burned**, but have not love, I gain nothing. (1 Cor 13:3, **ESV**)

And if I give all my possessions to feed the poor, and if I surrender my body **to be burned**, but do not have love, it profits me nothing. (1 Cor 13:3, **NASB**)

And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body **to be burned**, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing. (1 Cor 13:3, **KJV**)



1 Corinthians 13:4 AT

Love is forbearing; love is kind. Love does not envy, it does not brag, it is not conceited.



1 Corinthians 1:31 NIV

Therefore, as it is written:
“Let the one who **boasts**
boast in the Lord.”



1 Corinthians 5:1-2 NIV

1 It is actually reported that there is **sexual immorality** among you, and of a kind that even pagans do not tolerate: **A man is sleeping with his father's wife.** 2 And you are **proud** [*φουσιόω* | *physioō*]**!** Shouldn't you rather have gone into mourning and have **put out of your fellowship** the man who has been doing this?



1 Corinthians 13:5 AT

It does not behave
dishonorably, it is not self-
seeking, it is not provoked to
anger, it does not keep record of
wrong.



Philippians 2:3-4 NIV

3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, 4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.



1 Corinthians 10:23-24 NIV

23 “I have the right to do anything,” you say—but not everything is beneficial. “I have the right to do anything”—but not everything is constructive. 24 **No one should seek their own good, but the good of others.**



1 Corinthians 13:6 AT

2 Corinthians 7:8-9 NIV

8 Even if I caused you sorrow by my letter, I do not regret it. Though I did regret it—I see that my letter hurt you, but only for a little while—9 yet now I am happy, not because you were made sorry, but **because your sorrow led you to repentance. For you became sorrowful as God intended and so were not harmed in any way by us.**

1 Corinthians 13:8 AT

1 Corinthians 13:9-10 AT

9 For we know in part and we prophesy in part. 10 But when the perfect comes, what is in part comes to an end.
