



John 4:10 NIV

Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."





John 4:1-4 AT

1 Then, when Jesus knew that the Pharisees had heard that Jesus was making and baptizing more disciples than John 2 (although Jesus Himself did not baptize, but His disciples), 3 He left Judea and went away again to Galilee. 4 But it was necessary [δεῖ | dei] for Him to go through





John 3:30 NIV

He must $[\delta \epsilon i \mid dei]$ become greater; I must $[\delta \epsilon i \mid dei]$ become less.





Jeremiah 29:10-11 NIV

10 This is what the LORD [YHWH] says: "When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will come to you and fulfill my good promise to bring you back to this place. 11 For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD [YHWH], "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.





John 4:5-6 AT

5 So He goes to a city of Samaria called Sychar, near the field that Jacob had given to his son, Joseph. 6 Now Jacob's spring was there. So Jesus, because He had become tired from the journey, was sitting down thus by the spring. It was about noon [lit. sixth





John 4:7-9 AT

7 A woman from Samaria comes to draw water. Jesus says to her, "Give Me [some water] to drink." 8 (For His disciples had gone away into the city in order to buy food.) 9 Then the woman – the Samaritan – says to Him, "How is it that You, being a Jew, from me, being a Samaritan woman, ask for [some water] to drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.)





John 4:10 AT

Jesus answered and said to her, "If you had known the gift of God and who it is that is saying to you, "Give Me [something] to drink", you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.





John 4:11-12 AT

11 The woman says to Him, "Sir, you do not have a bucket and the well is deep. So, where do You get this living water?" 12 You're not greater than our father, Jacob who gave us the well, and who himself drank from it, as well as his sons and livestock – are you?





John 4:13-14 AT

13 Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who [habitually] drinks of this water will be thirsty again. 14 But whoever drinks of the water that I will give to them will never be thirsty for all eternity. Instead, the water that I will give to them will become in them a spring of water, welling up into eternal life.





John 7:37-39 NIV

37 On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. 38 Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." 39 By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.





John 6:35 NIV

Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty





Jeremiah 2:13 NIV

"My people have committed two sins:
They have forsaken me,
the spring of living water,
and have dug their own cisterns,
broken cisterns that cannot hold water.





Isaiah 12:3 NIV

With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.





John 4:15 AT

The woman says to Him, "Sir, give me this water so that I will not be thirsty nor [have to] come through here to draw [water]."





John 4:16-18 AT

16 He says to her, "Go, call your husband and come here." 17 The woman answered and said to Him, "I do not have a husband." Jesus says to her, "You have rightly said, 'A husband I do not have', 18 because five husbands you have had, and the [man] whom you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true!"





John 4:19-20 AT

19 The woman says to Him, "Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet. 20 Our fathers worshipped on this mountain. And yet you [Jews] say that the place where it is necessary $[\delta \epsilon \tilde{\imath} \mid dei]$ to worship is in Jerusalem.





John 4:21-22 AT

21 Jesus says to her, "Trust me, woman, that a time is coming when you [all] will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. 22 You [Samaritans] worship what you do not know; we [Jews] worship what we do know – because salvation is from the Jews.





John 4:23-24 AT

23 But a time is coming and is now [here] when true worshippers will worship the Father in Spirit and in truth. For the Father seeks such [people] who worship Him. 24 God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in Spirit and in truth.





John 8:31-32 AT

31 Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, "If you remain in my word, truly you are my disciples. 32 Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.





John 14:6 AT

Jesus says to Him, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."





1 Corinthians 2:11 NIV

For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God.





John 4:25-26 AT

25 The woman says to Him, "I know that Messiah" (the One who is called Christ) "is coming. Whenever He comes, that Man will explain everything to us." 26 Jesus says to her, "I – the One who is speaking to you – Iam [that Man]."
