12 And straight away the Spirit drives Him out into the wilderness [ἔρημος | erēmos]. 13 And He was in the wilderness [ἔρημος | erēmos] forty days, being tempted by Satan, and He was with the wild animals and the angels were serving Him. (Mk 1:12-13, AT)

And He would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew Him [(who He was)]. (Mk 1:32-34, AT)





And early in the morning, while still very dark, having got up, He came out [of the house] and went away to an **isolated** [$\xi \rho \eta \mu o \zeta \mid er\bar{e}mos$] place. And there He was praying. (Mk 1:35, AT)





In the morning, LORD [YHWH], you hear my voice; in the morning I lay my requests before you and wait expectantly. (Ps 5:3, NIV)





But I cry to you for help, LORD [YHWH];

in the morning my prayer comes before you. (Ps 88:13, NIV)





I rise before dawn and cry for help;

I have put my hope in your word. (Ps 119:147, NIV)





2 just as it is written in Isaiah the prophet: "Behold, I send my messenger before you, who will prepare your way. 3 A voice of one calling in the wilderness [ἔρημος | erēmos], 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make His paths straight." 4 John the Baptizer appeared in the wilderness [ἔρημος | erēmos], proclaiming a repentance-baptism for forgiveness of sins. (Mk 1:2-4, AT)

MARK 1:35 PRIVATE PRAYER



38 As he taught, Jesus said, "Watch out for the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, 39 and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honor at banquets. 40 They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely." (Mk 12:38-40, NIV)



MARK 1:35 FOLLOW DIVINE DIRECTIONS NOT THE CROWD



At daybreak, Jesus went out to a **solitary** [$\xi \rho \eta \mu o \zeta$ | $er\bar{e}mos$] place. The people were looking for him and when they came to where he was, **they tried to keep**

him from leaving them. (Lk 4:42, NIV)



MARK 1:35 FOLLOW DIVINE DIRECTIONS NOT THE CROWD



14 After the people saw the sign Jesus performed, they began to say, "Surely this is the Prophet who is to come into the world." 15 Jesus, knowing that they intended to come and make him king by force, withdrew again to a mountain by himself. (Jn 6:14-15, NIV)





And Simon and those with him went to track Him down [καταδιώκω | *katadiōkō*]. (Mk 1:36, AT)





Jacob was angry and took Laban to task. "What is my crime?" he asked Laban. "How have I wronged you that you **hunt me down** [LXX: καταδιώκω | *katadiōkō*]? (Gen 31:36, NIV)





I **pursued** [LXX: καταδιώκω | *katadiōkō*] my **enemies** and overtook them;

I did not turn back till they were destroyed.

(Ps 18:37, NIV / Ps 17:38, LXX)





Surely, goodness and loyal love will **pursue** [LXX: καταδιώκω | $katadi\bar{o}k\bar{o}$] me all the days of my life, And I will [continually] return to the house of the LORD [YHWH] for the length of my days.

(Ps 23:6, AT cf. Ps 22:6 LXX)



MARK 1:36 DEMONIC DISTRACTION



31 He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. 32 He spoke plainly about this, and **Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.**

33 But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns." (Mk 8:31-33, NIV)



MARK 1:37 SEEKING THE SAVIOR



And they found Him and say to Him, "Everyone is looking [$\zeta \eta \tau \epsilon \omega \mid z \bar{e} t e \bar{o}$] for You." (Mk 1:37, AT)



MARK 1:37 SEEKING THE SAVIOR



The chief priests and the teachers of the law heard this and began looking for [ζητέω | zēteō] a way to kill him, for they feared him, because the whole crowd was amazed at his teaching. (Mk 11:18, NIV)



MARK 1:37 SEEKING THE SAVIOR



Now the Passover and the Festival of Unleavened Bread were only two days away, and the chief priests and the teachers of the law were scheming [ζητέω | $z\bar{e}te\bar{o}$] to arrest Jesus secretly and kill him. (Mk 14:1, NIV)



MARK 1:38 ST. ELSEWHERE



And He says to them, "Let's go elsewhere to the neighboring towns, so that there also I may preach [κηρύσσω | $k\bar{e}ryss\bar{o}$]. Because, for this reason I came out [έξέρχομαι | exerchomai]." (Mk 1:38, AT)



MARK 1:38 CHRIST CAME TO PROCLAIM



14 Now after John was handed over [to be arrested], Jesus went into Galilee **proclaiming** [κηρύσσω | $k\bar{e}ryss\bar{o}$] the Gospel of God 15 and saying: "The [appointed] time has been fulfilled and the Kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe in the Gospel!" (Mk 1:14-15, AT)



MARK 1:38 CHRIST CAME TO PROCLAIM



But he said, "I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent."

(Lk 4:43, NIV)





saying, "What do You have to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You **come** [ἔρχομαι | *erchomai*] to destroy us? I know who You are — the Holy One of God (Mk 1:24, AT)





And having heard this, Jesus says to them, "It is not those who are healthy who have need of a doctor, but those who have bad [conditions]. I did not come [ἔρχομαι | erchomai] to call the righteous, but sinners. (Mk 2:17, AT)





For the Son of Man did not **come** [ἔρχομαι | *erchomai*] to be served, but to serve, and to give His life – a ransom for [(in place of)] many.

(Mk 10:45, AT)





Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would love me, for I have come [ἔρχομαι] erchomai] here from God. I have not come [ἔρχομαι | erchomai] on my own; God sent me. (Jn 8:42, NIV; cf. Jn 5:30, 8:28)



MARK 1:39 PREACHING A POWERFUL MESSAGE WITH POWER



And He went into all of Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons. (Mk 1:39, AT)



MARK 1:39 PREACHING A POWERFUL MESSAGE WITH POWER



But if I drive out demons by the finger of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. (Lk 11:20, NIV)



MARK 1:39 PREACHING A POWERFUL MESSAGE WITH POWER



19 Go, therefore, [and] make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit – teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And, listen: I am with you always – until the consummation of the age. (Mt 28:19-20, AT)



MARK 1:39 FERVOR DOES NOT EQUAL FAITH



Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill.

(Jn 6:26, NIV)
