


I. It Prepares Us For The Wilderness Matthew 4:1-2 NIV



1 Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. 2 After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry.



8 Then the LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered my servant Job? There is no one on earth like him; he is blameless and upright, a man who fears God and shuns evil."




I. It Prepares Us For The Wilderness James 1:2-4 NIV




II. It Prepares Us To Deal With The Evil One Psalm 91:11-12 NIV

Do not put the LORD your God to the test as you did at Massah.






To Deal With The Evil One Deuteronomy 6:13 NIV

Fear the LORD your God, serve him only and take your oaths in his name.


