- 15 Saul answered, "The soldiers brought them from the Amalekites; they spared the best of the sheep and cattle to sacrifice to the LORD [YHWH] your God, but we totally destroyed the rest." (1 Sam 15:14-15, NIV)

"Does the LORD [YHWH] delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as much as in obeying the LORD [YHWH]?

To obey is better than sacrifice,

and to heed is better than the fat of rams.

(1 Sam 15:22, NIV)





9 God said to Abraham, "As for you, you shall keep my covenant, you and your offspring after you throughout their generations. 10 This is my covenant, which you shall keep, between me and you and your offspring after you: Every male among you shall be circumcised.

11 You shall circumcise the flesh of your foreskins, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and you. (Gen 17:9-11, NRSV)





Throughout your generations every male among you shall be circumcised when he is eight days old, including the slave born in your house and the one bought with your money from any foreigner who is not of your offspring. 13 Both the slave born in your house and the one bought with your money must be circumcised. So shall my covenant be in your flesh an everlasting covenant. 14 Any uncircumcised male who is not circumcised in the flesh of his foreskin shall be cut off from his people; he has broken my covenant." (Gen 17:12-14, NRSV)





Circumcise, then, the foreskin of your heart, and do not be stubborn any longer. (Dt 10:16, NRSV)





Moreover, the LORD [YHWH] your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your descendants, so that you will love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, in order that you may live. (Dt 30:6, NRSV)





Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.

(Ps 51:10, NIV)





- 7 You hypocrites! Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you:
 - 8 "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me.
 - 9 They worship me in vain; their teachings are merely **human rules**.'" [Is 29:13]

(Mt 15:7-9, NIV)





17 "Don't you see that whatever enters the mouth goes into the stomach and then out of the body? 18 But the things that come out of a person's mouth come from the **heart**, and these defile them. 19 For **out of the heart** come **evil thoughts**—murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander. 20 These are what defile a person; but eating with unwashed hands does not defile them." (Mt 15:17-20, NIV)





25 "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you clean the outside of the cup and the plate, but inside they are full of greed and self-indulgence. 26 You blind Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and the plate, that the outside also may be clean. (Mt 23:25-26, ESV)

- 3 Who may ascend the mountain of the LORD [YHWH]? Who may stand in his holy place?
- 4 The one who has clean hands and a **pure** [LXX: καθαρός | *katharos*] **heart** [LXX: καρδία | *kardia*]

who does not trust in an idol or swear by a false god.

(Ps 24:3-4, NIV)



MATTHEW 5:8 PURELY DEVOTED TO THE LORD



- 5 They will receive blessing from the LORD [YHWH] and vindication from God their Savior.
- 6 Such is the generation of those who seek him, who seek your face, God of Jacob.

(Ps 24:5-6, NIV)







4 Listen, O Israel! The LORD [YHWH] is our God, the LORD [YHWH] alone. 5 Love the LORD [YHWH] your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. (Dt 6:4-5, AT)





Truly God is good to the upright, to those who are pure in heart.

(Ps 73:1, NRSV)





- ²But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; my steps had nearly slipped.
- ³For I was envious of the arrogant; I saw the prosperity of the wicked. (Ps 73:2-3, NRSV)





- ⁴ For they have no pain; their bodies are sound and sleek.
- ⁵ They are not in trouble as others are; they are not plagued like other people.
- ⁶ Therefore pride is their necklace; violence covers them like a garment. (Ps 73:4-6, NRSV)





- ⁷ Their eyes swell out with fatness; their hearts overflow with follies.
- ⁸ They scoff and speak with malice; loftily they threaten oppression.
- ⁹ They set their mouths against heaven, and their tongues range over the earth. (Ps 73:7-9, NRSV)





- Therefore the people turn and praise them, and find no fault in them.
- And they say, "How can God know? Is there knowledge in the Most High?"
- Such are the wicked; always at ease, they increase in riches. (Ps 73:10-12, NRSV)





- ¹³ All in vain I have **kept my heart clean** and washed my hands in innocence.
- ¹⁴ For all day long I have been plagued,
 and am punished every morning.
 (Ps 73:13-14, NRSV)





- I would have been untrue to the circle of your children.
- ¹⁶ But when I thought how to understand this, it seemed to me a wearisome task, (Ps 73:15-16, NRSV)





- ¹⁷ until I went into the sanctuary of God; then I perceived their end.
- ¹⁸ Truly you set them in slippery places; you make them fall to ruin.

(Ps 73:17-18, NRSV)





- ¹⁹ How they are destroyed in a moment, swept away utterly by terrors!
- ²⁰ They are like a dream when one awakes; on awaking you despise their phantoms. (Ps 73:19-20, NRSV)

 I have made the Lord GOD my refuge,
 to tell of all your works.
 (Ps 73:27-28, NRSV)



MATTHEW 5:8 SEEING GOD



- 18 Then Moses said, "Please, let me see Your glory."
- 19 He said, "I will cause all My goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim the name Yahweh [YHWH] before you. I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion."
- (Ex 33:18-19, HCSB)



MATTHEW 5:8 SEEING GOD



20 But He answered, "You cannot see My face, for no one can see Me and live." 21 The LORD [YHWH] said, "Here is a place near Me. You are to stand on the rock, 22 and when My glory passes by, I will put you in the crevice of the rock and cover you with My hand until I have passed by. 23 Then I will take My hand away, and you will see My back, but My face will not be seen." (Ex 33:20-23, HCSB)





No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is himself God and is in closest relationship with the Father, has made him known. (Jn 1:18, NIV)





In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. (Is 6:1, NIV)





3 When Moses went and told the people all the LORD's [YHWH] words and laws, they responded with one voice, "Everything the LORD [YHWH] has said we will do." 4 Moses then wrote down everything the LORD [YHWH] had said.

He got up early the next morning and built an **altar** at the foot of the mountain and set up twelve stone pillars representing the twelve tribes of Israel. 5 Then he sent young Israelite men, and they offered burnt offerings and sacrificed young bulls as fellowship offerings to the LORD [YHWH].(Ex 24:3-5, NIV)





6 Moses took half of the blood and put it in bowls, and the other half he splashed against the altar. 7 Then he took the Book of the **Covenant** and read it to the people. They responded, "**We will do** everything the LORD has said; we will obey." (Ex 24:6-7, NIV)





Moses then took the **blood**, **sprinkled it on the people** and said, "This is the **blood of the covenant** that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words." (Ex 24:8, NIV)





9 Moses and Aaron, Nadab and Abihu, and the seventy elders of Israel went up 10 and saw the God of Israel. Under his feet was something like a pavement made of lapis lazuli [sapphire], as bright blue as the sky. 11 But God did not raise his hand against these leaders of the Israelites; they saw God, and they ate and drank. (Ex 24:9-12, NIV)





I say to you that many will come from the east and the west, and will take their places at the feast with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. (Mt 8:11, NIV)





1 Jesus spoke to them again in parables, saying: 2 "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son. (Mt 22:1-2, NIV)





For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. (1 Cor 13:12, NIV)





- 25 I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.
- 26 And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God;

(Job 19:25-26, NIV)





Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. (1 Jn 3:2, NIV)
