



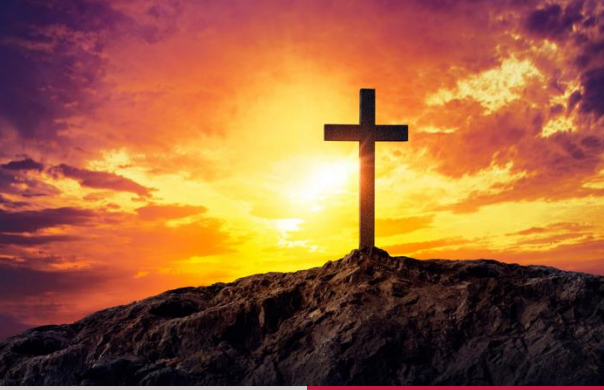

## CONTEXT STRIPPED ACCORDING TO THE SCRIPT(URE)



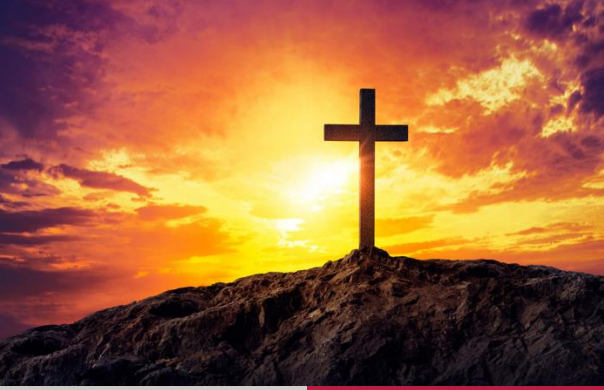
23 When the soldiers crucified Jesus, they took his clothes, dividing them into four shares, one for each of them, with the undergarment remaining. This garment was seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom.

24 “Let’s not tear it,” they said to one another. “Let’s decide by lot who will get it.” This happened that the scripture might be fulfilled that said,

“They divided my clothes among them  
and cast lots for my garment.” [Ps 22:18]

So this is what the soldiers did. (Jn 19:23-24, NIV)





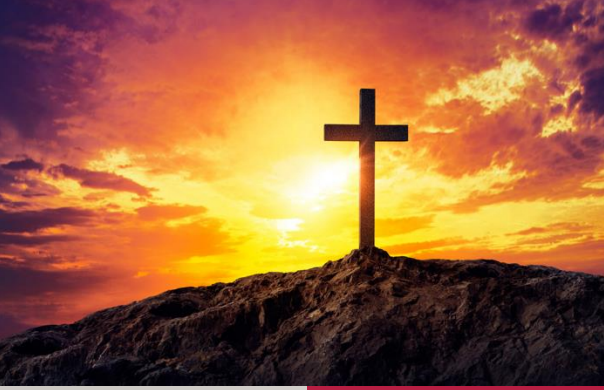

(Jn 19:25, AT)





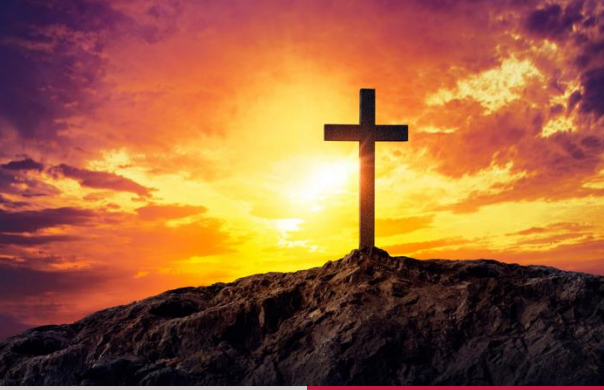

**Joseph, and Salome.** (Mk 15:40, NIV)



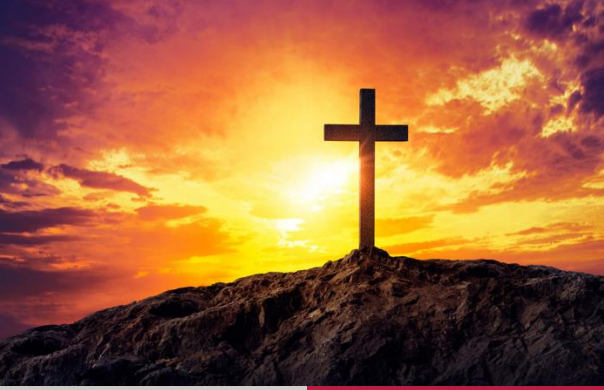

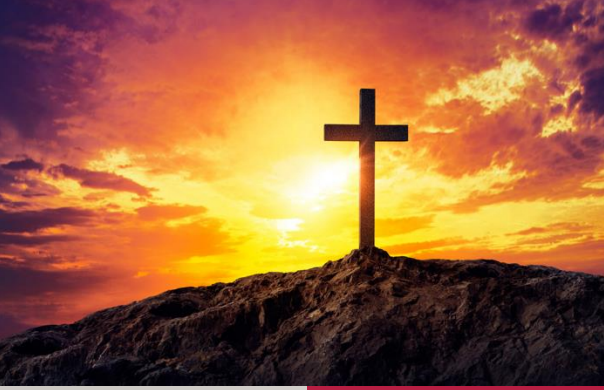


22 His disciples stared at one another, at a loss to know which of them he meant. 23 One of them, **the disciple whom Jesus loved**, was reclining next to him.

24 Simon Peter motioned to this disciple and said, “Ask him which one he means.” (Jn 13:32-34, NIV)







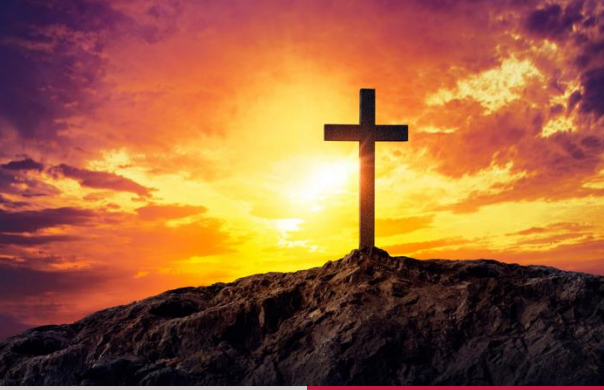

(Jn 16:32, NIV)





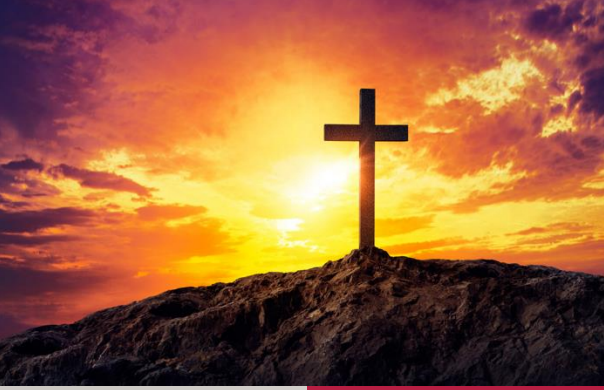
## JOHN 19:27 NEW MOM



1 After this, Jesus went around in Galilee. He did not want to go about in Judea because the Jewish leaders there were looking for a way to kill him. 2 But when the Jewish Festival of Tabernacles was near, 3 Jesus' **brothers** said to him, "Leave Galilee and go to Judea, so that your disciples there may see the works you do. 4 No one who wants to become a public figure acts in secret. Since you are doing these things, show yourself to the world." 5 **For even his own brothers did not believe in him.** (Jn 7:1-5, NIV)

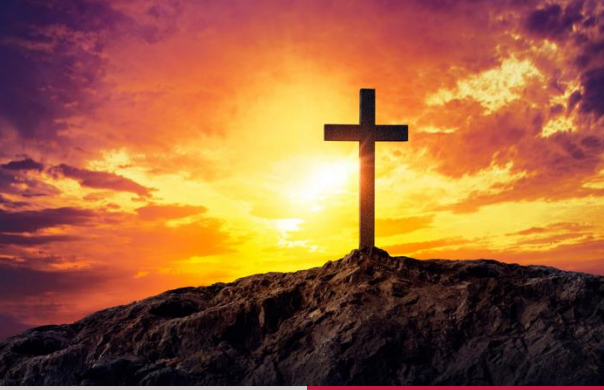


33 **“Who are my mother and my brothers?”** he asked.

35 **Whoever does God’s will is my brother and sister and mother.”** (Mk 3:33-35, NIV; cf. Mk 6:4)



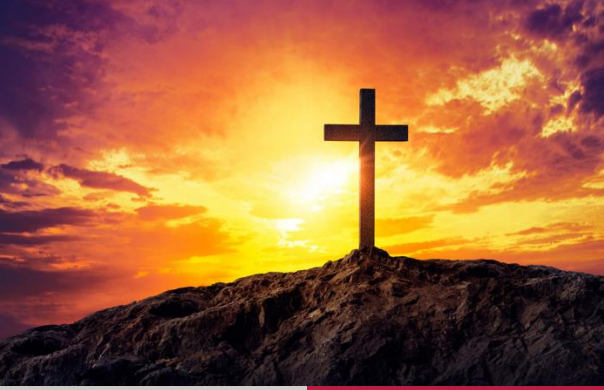

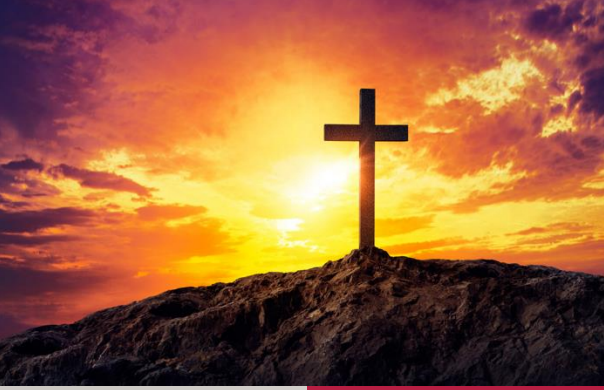

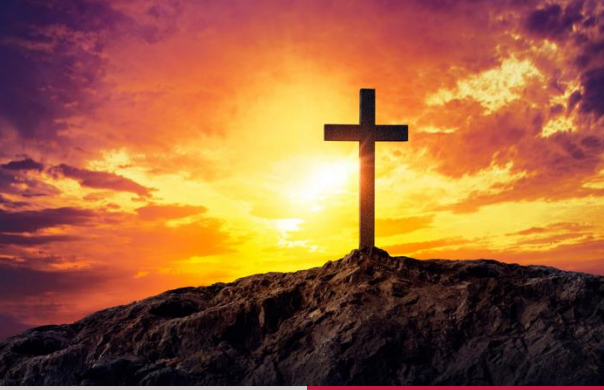

(Jn 4:34, AT)



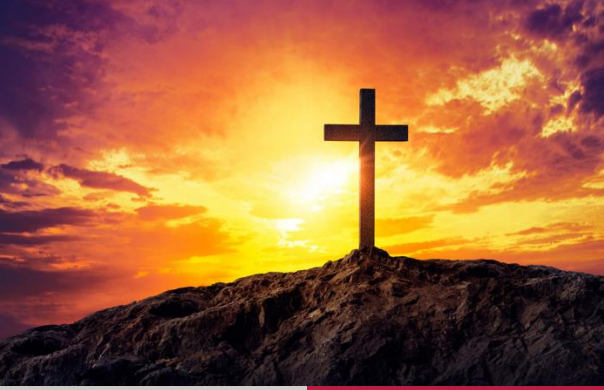

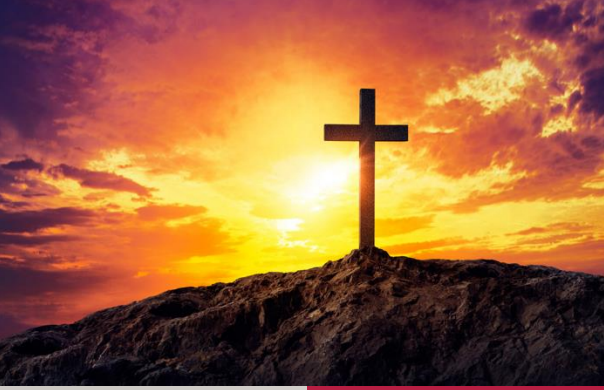
**My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?**

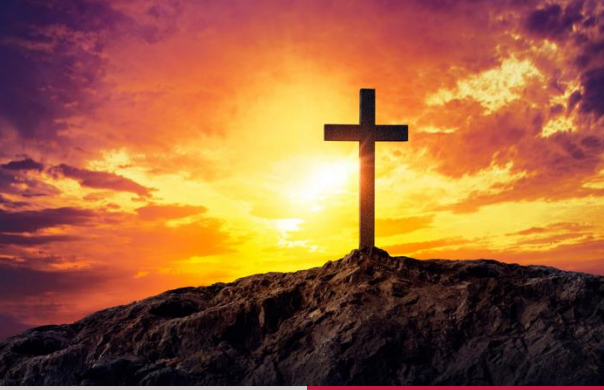

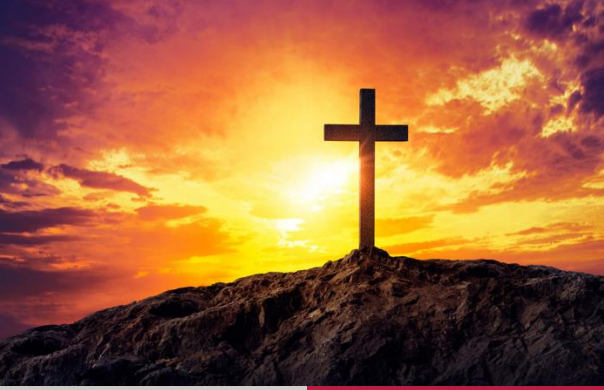

they **pierce my hands and my feet.**

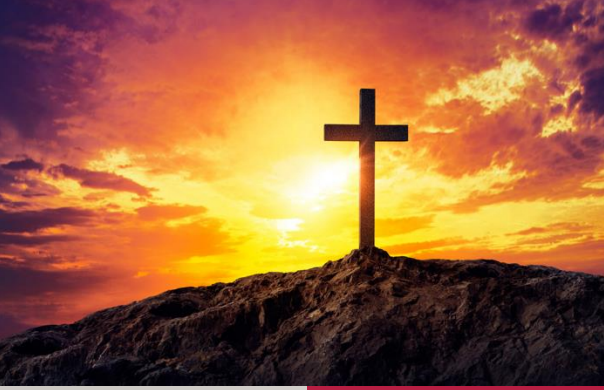

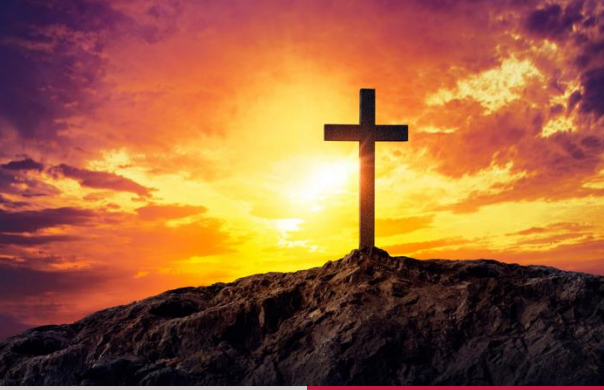

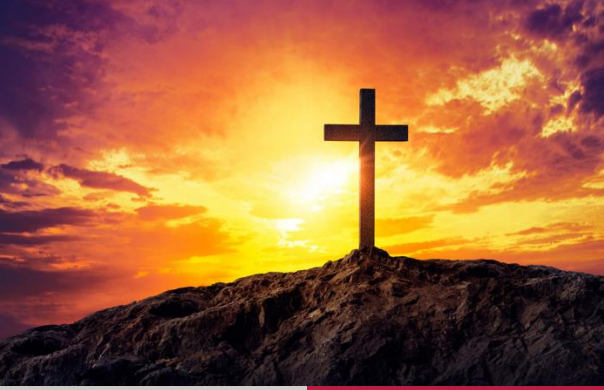

37 On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, “Let anyone who is **thirsty come to me and drink.**

38 Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, **rivers of living water will flow from within them.”** 39 **By this he meant the Spirit,** whom those who believed in him were **later** to receive. **Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.** (Jn 7:37-39, NIV; cf. Jn 6:35)





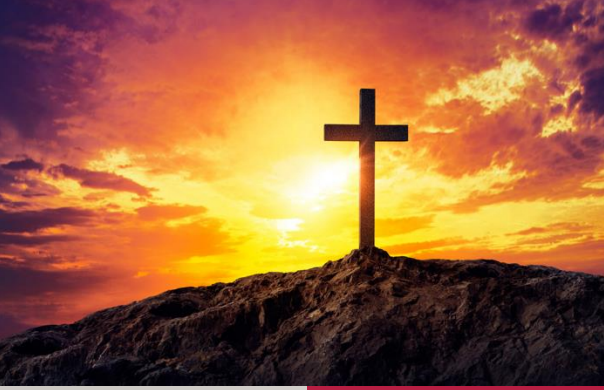

A jar full of wine vinegar was there. So, they put a sponge full of wine vinegar [ὄξος | *oxos*] on a hyssop [stalk] and brought it to His mouth. (Jn 19:29, AT)





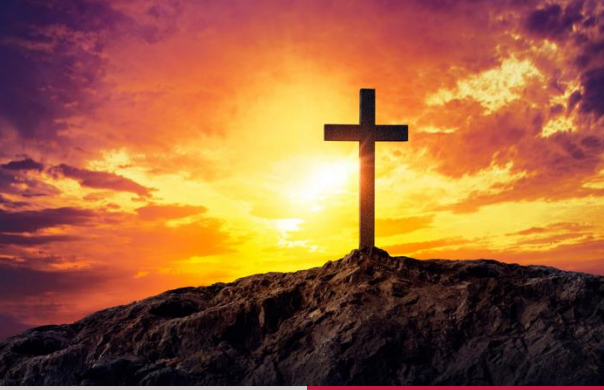

9 When the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine, and did not know from where it came (though the servants who had drawn out the water knew), the master of the banquet calls the bridegroom over 10 and says to him, "Everyone puts the **good wine** out first. Then, when people become intoxicated, [they put out] the inferior wine. You have saved the **good wine** till now!" (Jn 2:9-10, AT)



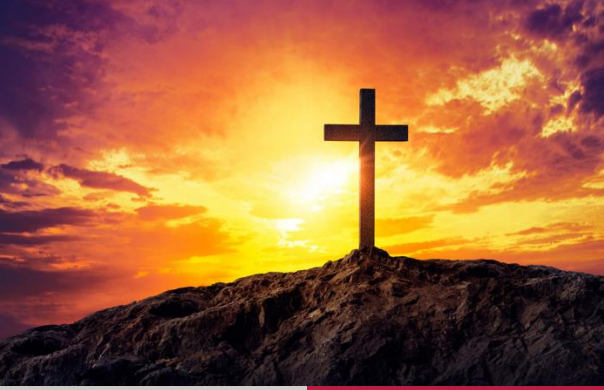

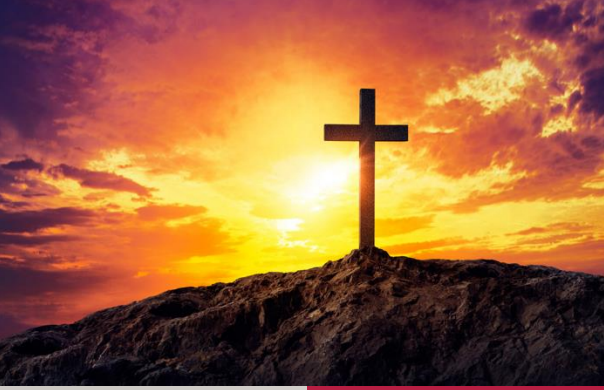

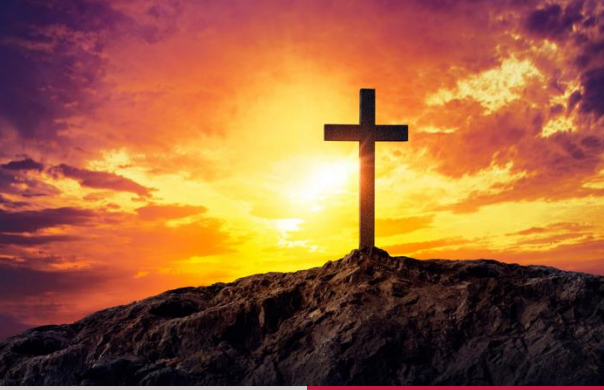

21 Then Moses summoned all the elders of Israel and said to them, “Go at once and select the animals for your families and slaughter the **Passover lamb**. 22 Take a bunch of **hyssop**, dip it into the blood in the basin and put some of the blood on the top and on both sides of the doorframe. None of you shall go out of the door of your house until morning. 23 When the LORD [YHWH] goes through the land to strike down the Egyptians, he will see the blood on the top and sides of the doorframe and will **pass over** that doorway, and he will not permit the destroyer to enter your houses and strike you down. (Ex 12:21-23, NIV)

“Here is your king,” Pilate said to the Jews.

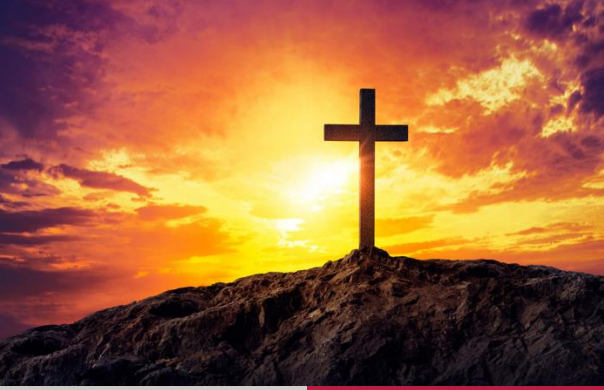
15 But they shouted, “Take him away! Take him away! Crucify him!”

(Jn 19:14-15, NIV)





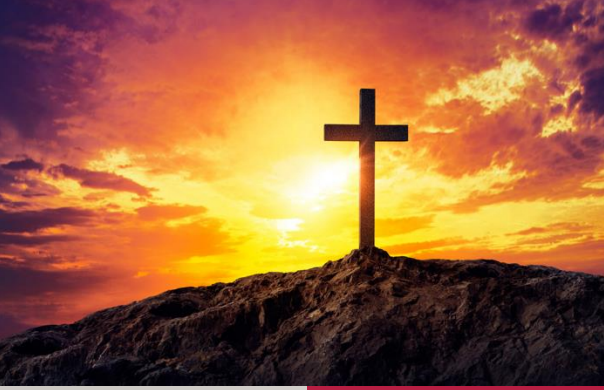

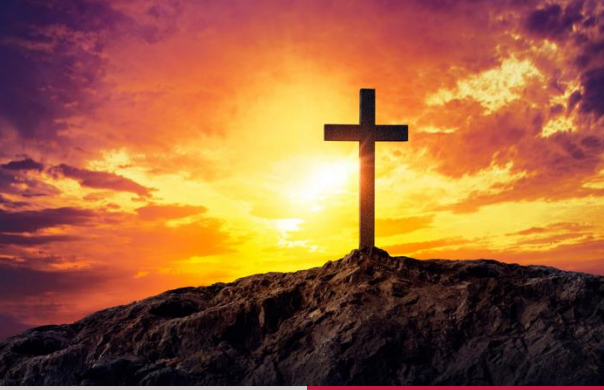

(Ex 12:46, NIV; cf. Num 9:12)



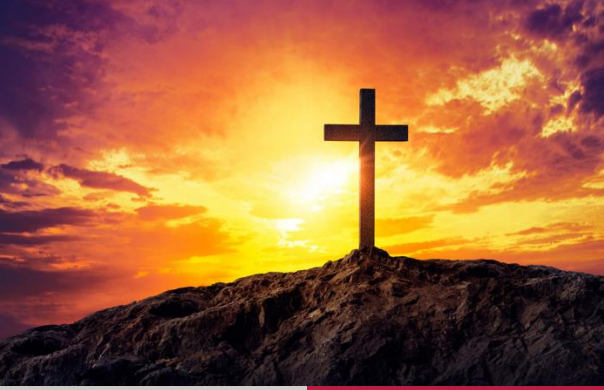

33 But when they came to Jesus and found that he was **already dead**, **they did not break his legs**. 34 Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water. 35 The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe. 36 These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: “**Not one of his bones will be broken**,” (Jn 19:33-36, NIV; cf. Ex 12:46; Ps 34:19-20)

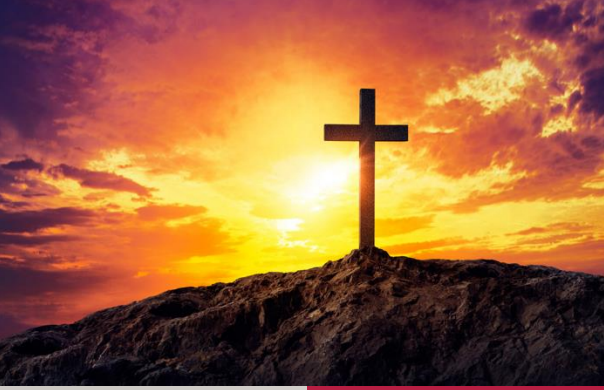


**For Christ, our **Passover** lamb,**

**(1 Cor 5:7b, NIV** ; cf. Jn 18:28, 19:36; 1 Pet 1:19)





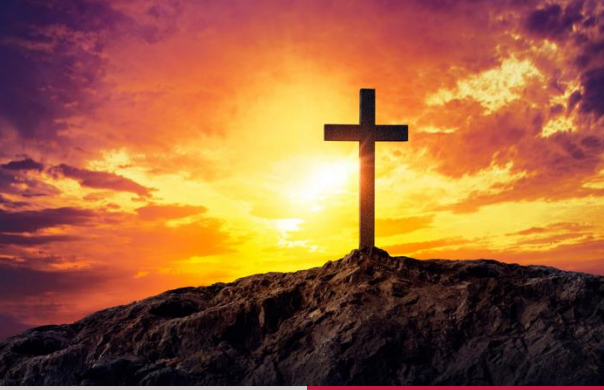

Then, when He received the wine vinegar, Jesus said, "It is finished [τελέω | *teleō*]." And, He bowed [His] head, and gave up [παραδίδωμι | *paradidōmi*] [His] spirit. (Jn 19:30, AT)



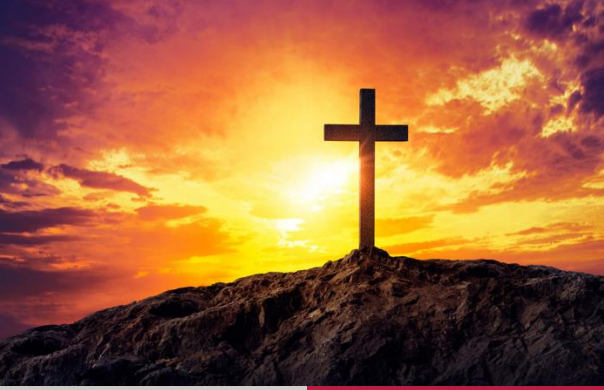

The evening meal was in progress, and the **devil** had already prompted **Judas**, the son of Simon Iscariot, to **betray** [παραδίδωμι | *paradidōmi*] Jesus. (Jn 13:2, NIV)





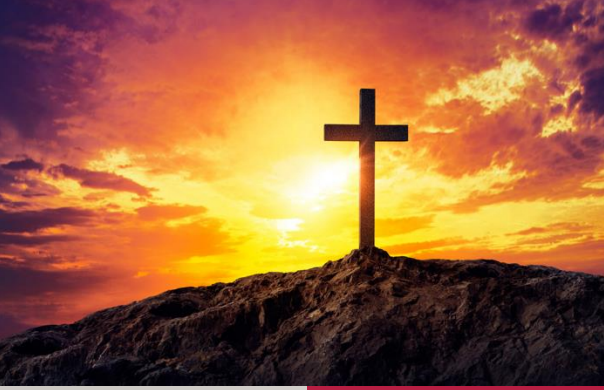

Finally Pilate **handed him over**  
[παράδίδωμι | *paradidōmi*] to them to  
be **crucified**. So the soldiers took  
charge of Jesus. (Jn 19:16, NIV)

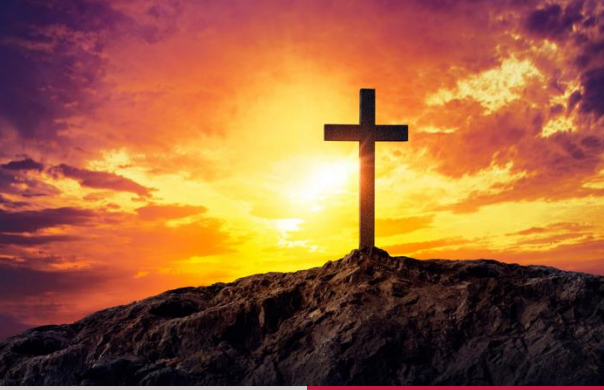


Therefore I will give him a portion among the great,

(Is 53:12, NIV)



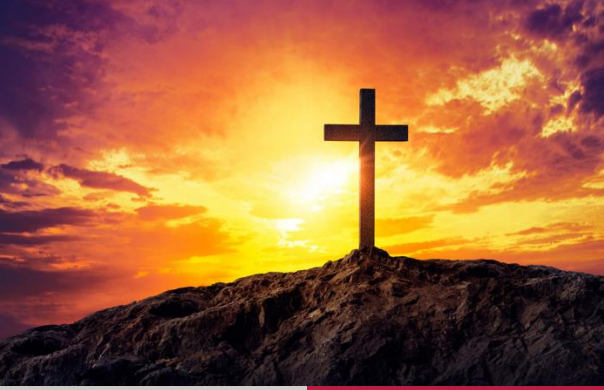

those who cannot keep themselves alive.

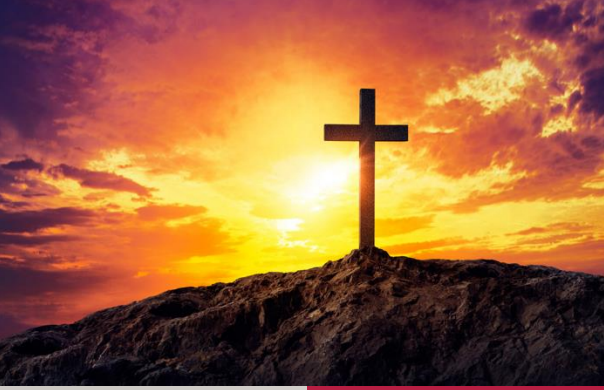
30 Posterity will serve him;
